#### **INVESTING IN FUTURE LEADERS**

Education remains one of our most powerful tools for developing tomorrow's industry leaders. In 2024, we invested **nearly \$1** million in scholarships, supporting 360 students across more than 80 institutions. Our expanded **HBCU Travel Scholarship program** reached a record **63** participants across six historically Black colleges and universities, reflecting our commitment to building a diverse leadership pipeline. These scholarships do more than fund education – they create connections to industry mentors, provide networking opportunities, and offer professional development resources that help students transition successfully into hospitality careers.

# COMMUNITY-BASED PROJECTS: OPENING DOORS TO OPPORTUNITY

The first step in building a strong workforce is introducing talented individuals to the possibilities of hospitality careers. Many of tomorrow's industry leaders haven't yet discovered the potential of a hospitality career. In 2024, our Empowering Youth Program (EYP) — with the help of a grant from Conrad N. Hilton Foundation — helped over 200 individuals across Los Angeles, Orlando, and Austin discover hospitality careers. Each participant represents not just a job filled, but a career launched, and a life potentially transformed.


# RETENTION

#### **BUILDING CAREERS, NOT JUST JOBS**

Employee turnover costs the hotel industry billions annually, but the real cost goes beyond finances. When experienced employees leave, we lose institutional knowledge, guest relationships, and team cohesion. AHLA Foundation was recognized by the Department of Labor in 2024 as an Apprenticeship Ambassador for our role in addressing this challenge head-on. By enrolling 400 new apprentices (though 18 employers) in 2024 and reaching over 2,000 total participants across 86 employers in our Registered Apprenticeship program, we're showing employees that they don't need to leave to grow. Each apprentice who advances represents both cost savings for their employer and a strengthened industry talent pipeline. This program's success lies in its practical approach to career advancement. Apprentices earn while they learn, gaining new skills without leaving their current roles. Our apprenticeship program has three tracks: Manager, Hotel Cook, and Maintenance Employee. The program's expansion to include Maintenance Employee certification, which celebrated its first graduates in 2024, demonstrates our ability to adapt to industry needs while creating new advancement pathways.

# START HERE, GROW ANYWHERE: PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AS A STRATEGY

The Foundation's **Professional Development scholarship** offers qualified employees access to earn **over 20 different industry certifications** that help retain and advance the workforce. Through the American Hotel & Lodging Educational Institute, these certifications cover everything from entry level and department head skills to executive level certifications. In 2024, as a result of a concerted effort to market and promote scholarship options, the Foundation awarded 377 individual scholarships, a significant increase from prior years.

# Uniting the Hotel Industry Against Human Trafficking

The AHLA Foundation's No Room for Trafficking (NRFT) initiative represents the hotel industry's comprehensive commitment to combat human trafficking and support survivors. NRFT raises awareness the prevalence of human trafficking's while positioning the hotel industry as a leader in private sector solutions. In 2024, NRFT trained over 308,400 industry professionals to recognize and report suspected instances of human trafficking, which is about a 20% increase from 2023. Since the beginning of the NRFT initiative, the anti-trafficking training – developed by Marriott and administered by PACT – has been completed more than 2 million times. bringing our cumulative total to 2.2 million since the inception of this initiative. The Foundation attended nine forums where leaders gathered to share best practices and track progress toward eradicating human trafficking in the hotel industry.

Through its groundbreaking **NRFT Survivor Fund**– the first of its kind in hospitality – NRFT
provides direct support to community-based
organizations that help trafficking survivors
rebuild their lives. The **650 survivors** supported
through our Survivor Fund show how the
industry can come together to disrupt human
trafficking, equipping individuals with
meaningful employment opportunities to
protect vulnerabilities.

#### **NRFT SUMMIT**

The AHLA Foundation's No Room for Trafficking Summit brings together hoteliers, survivors, and cross-industry partners in a powerful demonstration of our industry's united commitment to combat human trafficking. Through expert panels and the sharing of best practices, participants strengthen their knowledge and capabilities while forging stronger networks for prevention and response. The Summit exemplifies how the hotel industry is taking a leadership role in addressing this critical issue, working across sectors to strengthen the industry's comprehensive approach to preventing and responding to human trafficking.

# ForWard Conference & Regional Events


The AHLA Foundation's ForWard Conference is a transformative gathering that celebrates and empowers women leaders in hospitality. The **signature 2-day event** brings together industry changemakers for inspiring keynotes, dynamic workshops, and meaningful networking.

ForWard Regional events localize the experience of the ForWard Conference by bringing ForWard's energizing blend of professional development, mentorship, and community-building to key markets — expanding our reach and ensuring more women in hospitality can access the tools, networks, and inspiration to advance their careers and lead our industry forward. In 2024, the ForWard Conference brought together 884 professionals for high-impact learning and networking. The six regional events — hosted in Atlanta, GA; Columbus, OH; Washington, DC; Chicago, IL; Las Vegas, NV; and Orange County, CA — extended these opportunities to 540 additional participants.
